

Oakridge Public Schools is a comprehensive school district that proudly educates nearly 2,000 students in grades K-12. We continually strive to be an example for other school districts to follow by providing an exemplary educational experience to all students. We have a Community Senior Center, Great Start Readiness Program (preschool program), and the Fusion program. We enjoy strong community support. We benefit from the MAISD Technology & Security Enhancement Millage generating 1.0 mill of revenue (\$380,000/year), which will be considered for renewal in 2024. This funded the expansion of single secure entries to our schools and one device for every student in grades K-12. Most recently, our community passed a 1.24 mill bond in November of 2019, generating \$16.1 million for building expansion and repairs. We have established the Oakridge Wellness Network which includes a Teen Health Center in partnership with Hackley Community Care. Private donations have provided community health worker services from Mercy Health Hospital's Health Project. A partnership with DHHS provides a Pathways to Potential Center on-site. Kids Hope, Empowered Kids, and other community organizations partner with us to support kids mental and behavioral health. Our partnership with the Boys and Girls Club of the Muskegon Lakeshore provided after school and summer programs in grades 4-8.
